Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it (1 Cor. 9:24).

I never thought I would see the day when it would happen. I am officially someone who walks, rather than runs. That's right, although I still lace up my *Brooks Adrenaline GTs*, I no longer do so to run (jog really slowly?) around the neighborhood.



I am a walker, not a runner. And while I recognize the physical benefits to my knees and other parts of my physical body of choosing walking over running, I also understand that—from a spiritual standpoint—I need to keep running.

One of the metaphors that the Bible uses to describe the Christian life is a race. Whether we like to run or not, as Christians, we are all in a race. Watching from the sidelines as others run in the race is not a viable option.

Paul put it this way, "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:14). The word translated by the phrase, "press on," means "to move rapidly and decisively toward the objective" (William Arndt et al., *A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature,* Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2000, 254). We are to *run hard* when it comes to the Christian life.

I may be a walker when it comes to physical exercise, but that is not what I want to be when it comes to the Christian life. Are you "pressing on" like God would have you run, or are you walking slowly and somewhat indecisively? Let's make sure we are running in the race to obtain the prize in Christ Jesus.
